HB 4028 \*\*

\*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Imposes requirements and restrictions on insurer and coordinated care organization audits of claims for reimbursement submitted by behavioral health treatment providers.

HB 4069

Requires a behavioral health employer to develop and implement a written safety plan.

HB 4070

Provides that a community mental health program is not responsible for the cost of emergency psychiatric care, custody and treatment when state funds provided to the community mental health program are exhausted.

HB 4115 \*\*

\*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Provides that a criminal records check on certain caregivers shall last for three years, subject to exceptions.

#### Public Hearing

HB 4042

Expands the types of adverse licensing actions the Department of Human Services may take against child-caring agencies following certain findings.

HB 4110

Allows an attending physician to provide ibogaine to a patient for the patient's consumption to treat certain disorders.
