HB 4045 A

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 02-23-26 MEETING: Requires a social media platform to respond to a search warrant within 72 hours of service, and all other communications providers to respond within five business days of service, when the warrant pertains to an investigation of stalking or a crime constituting domestic violence.

HB 4072

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 02-23-26 MEETING: Excludes specified periods of time from the time period within which a person released from custody must be arraigned.

HB 4157

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 02-23-26 MEETING: Provides that certain hearsay statements related to certain sex crimes are not inadmissible in evidence, even though the declarant is available as a witness.

HB 4041 A

Reduces penalties for driving while suspended if the suspension is due to a conviction for criminal mischief resulting from the operation of a motor vehicle or reckless driving.

HB 4088 A

Declares this state's policy to protect engagement in certain activities relating to reproductive health care and gender-affirming treatment.

HB 4111 A

Provides that evidence of a party's or a witness's immigration status is not admissible as evidence in a civil proceeding.

HB 4114 A

Creates a civil cause of action against certain individuals who under color of law enter certain property without a warrant or an exception to the warrant requirement.

HB 4137 A

Provides that, in lieu of making a first appearance for a traffic violation citation, the person who is the previous owner of a vehicle may notify the court that the person has transferred interest in the vehicle and is not liable for the citation.

HB 4140 A

Modifies the crime of criminal mischief in the first degree by expanding the types of telecommunications entities whose property may be subject to ORS 164.365.

HB 4143 A

Authorizes the Governor to direct state agencies to withhold moneys owed to the federal government if federal funds are being withheld from the state in contravention of a valid court order.

HB 4151 A

Increases the penalties for the crime of initiating a false report when a person intentionally causes an enhanced law enforcement response and recklessly causes serious physical injury or death as a result of the response.

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
