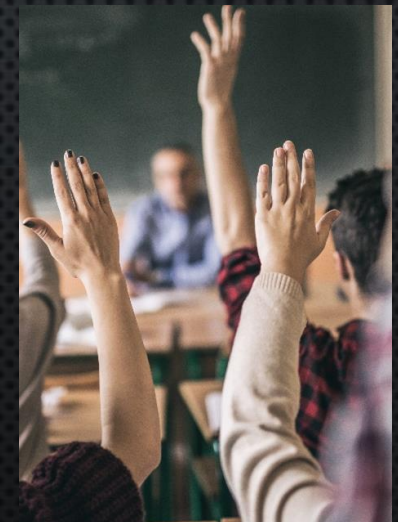

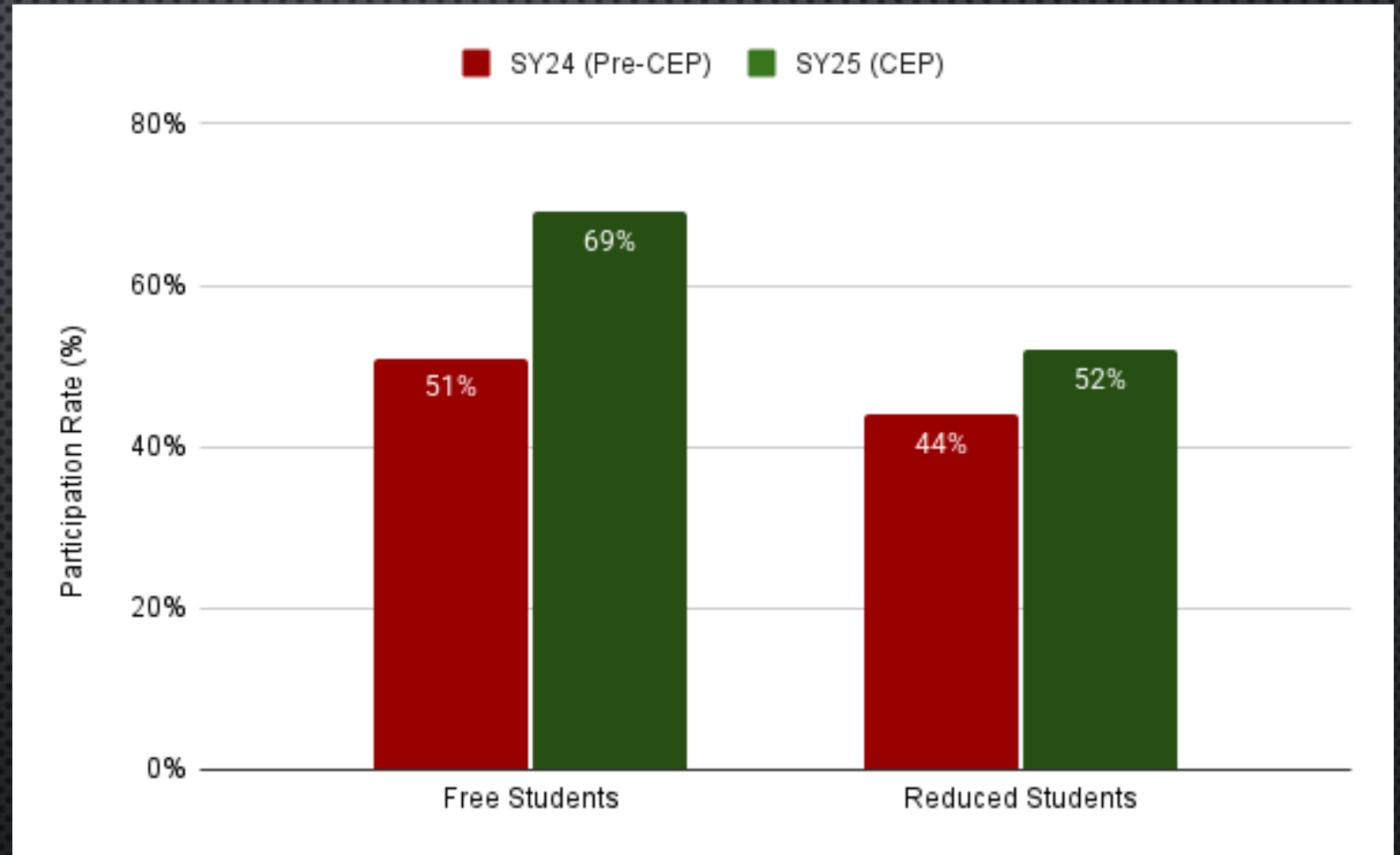

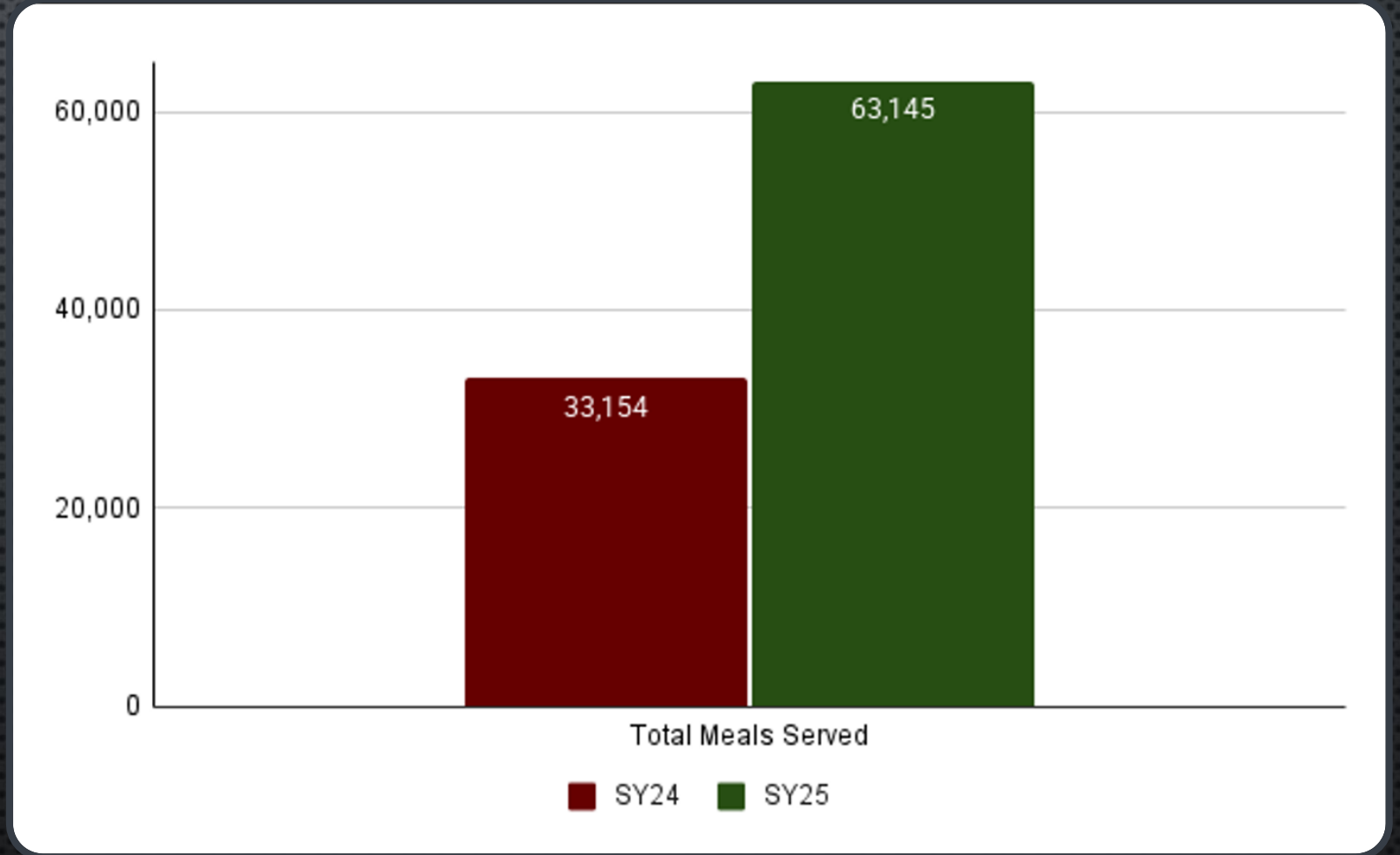

BUDGET IMPLICATIONS

- ACTIVE MEAL DEBT DUE TO DISTRICT: • \$57,975
- APPROXIMATE ANNUAL WRITE-OFF FROM MEAL DEBTS FOR INACTIVE STUDENTS: • \$10,000
- TRANSFER FROM THE GENERAL FUND ANNUALLY TO SUPPORT NUTRITION SERVICES PROGRAM • \$225,000
