## SUMMARY

Digest: The Act sets the amounts allowed to be spent on capital construction. (Flesch Readability Score: 67.7).

Establishes and modifies limits on payment of expenses from specified funds by certain state agencies for capital construction.

Declares an emergency, effective on passage.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to state financial administration; creating new provisions; amending section 1, chapter 631, Oregon Laws 2025; and declaring an emergency.

**Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

**SECTION 1.** Section 1, chapter 631, Oregon Laws 2025, is amended to read:

**Sec. 1.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts are established for a six-year period beginning July 1, 2025, as the maximum limits for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the state agencies listed, for the acquisition of land and the acquisition, planning, constructing, altering, repairing, furnishing and equipping of buildings and facilities:

**SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, and in lieu of the limitation on expenditures established at the December 9, 2022, Emergency Board meeting (Item No. 19), the amount of \$4,300,000 is established for a six-year period beginning July 1, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses for the Corvallis Armory Service Life Extension project from federal funds collected or received by the Oregon Military Department.**

**SECTION 3. This 2026 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2026 Act takes effect on its passage.**
