Emergency Management

- **Phase 1: Stabilization (Response / Initial Recovery) (ECC Activated)**
 - Response and recovery efforts taking place concurrently (Emergency Support Functions (ESFs) activated)
 - Recovery Support Function (RSF) Coordinating Agencies may be engaged through active monitoring until fully activated.
- **Phase 2: Recovery Operations**
 - Response operations concluded. Coordination of statewide recovery operations continues through active RSF engagement with partner agencies and impacted jurisdictions.
- **Phase 3: Long-term Recovery**
 - Recovery activities complete and/or have transitioned back to individual state agency responsibilities and long-term recovery program implementation.





Individual Assistance – Public Assistance

Harney County and Burns Paiute Tribe

March 12 – April 15, 2025: Flooding

Assistance Provided

- Public Assistance damages - \$1,159,282
- As of December 29, 2025, the SBA provided 6 disaster loans and disbursed \$313,000
- State funding allocated to date for Individual Assistance:
 - \$69,899 for Disaster Case Management
 - \$307,975 for flexible funding needs including home repairs

Individual Assistance – Public Assistance


Coos, Curry, Douglas, and Josephine counties

March 13 – March 20, 2025, Flooding, Landslides, Mudslides, and Severe Storms

Assistance Provided

- As of December 29, 2025, the SBA provided 17 disaster loans and disbursed \$538,800
- State funding allocation for Individual Assistance:
 - \$94,592 for Disaster Case Management
 - \$707,178 for flexible funding needs ex. home repairs, insulation, HVAC, and debris removal
- FEMA Public Assistance Approved – current estimate of eligible projects is \$13,742,973 (federal cost share)
- No Hazard Mitigation Grant Program/Individual Assistance Federally

Impacts

Assistance Provided

As of December 29, 2025, the SBA provided 6 disaster loans and disbursed \$274,600

- Individual Assistance
 - \$15,000 flex funds provided by ODHS to local community action council
- Public Assistance
 - \$3.5 million (state, not federal) to the county for debris removal





3 Awarded 270 pieces of incident equipment throughout the state to more than 150 jurisdictions/agencies




Disaster Preparedness Stockpile


