ALCOHOL AND DRUG POLICY COMMISSION

The Governor has appointed the following individual to the Alcohol and Drug Policy Commission subject to Senate confirmation.¹

New Appointment

Statement of Economic Interest²

Not required.

Composition³

The commission consists of no more than 27 members, up to 24 of which are appointed by the Governor. Membership includes:

- one member of a federally recognized Indian tribe (CRUZ);
- one county commissioner, manager, or administrator (MINTY);
- nine health care providers who have substance use disorder expertise and who, collectively, have experience in the following settings:
 - outpatient care (DAVIS, JOKINEN);
 - inpatient care (FULLER, OBIERO);
 - emergency response (LOEFFLER);
 - housing for people who have a current diagnosis of a substance use disorder or who are in recovery (KNUDSON); or
 - peer support (MINES, PEÑA, VEZINA);
- one certified prevention specialists (JONES);
- one coordinated care organization representative (ANDONIADIS);
- one representative of the criminal justice system:
 - county sheriff (MASSEY);
 - chief of police; or

- community corrections director;
- one attorney:
 - district attorney;
 - criminal defense (HUPY); or
 - assistant attorney general;
- one community mental health program representative (MERILA-SIMMONS);
- one health insurer representative (ALDEN);
- one county juvenile department director (**CEARLEY**);
- one school administrator (DURSI-MARTIN);
- one city representative (NORDYKE);
- one local public health administrator (LYNCH);
- up to three representatives from different participating state agencies, including one from a primarily youth serving agency, *nonvoting*;
 - Oregon Health Authority (CLARKE);
- one senator, appointed by the President of the Senate, *nonvoting* (REYNOLDS);
- one representative, appointed by the Speaker of the House, *nonvoting* (SANCHEZ); and
- a circuit court judge, appointed by the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, *nonvoting*: (VACANT).

Members serve four-year terms. The Governor appoints a director, chair, and vice chair. Membership must ensure representation from every region of the state and from individuals with lived experience with substance use disorder and their family members.

Duties

The commission is charged with improving access to evidence-based, evidence-informed, and culturally informed substance use prevention, substance use disorder treatment, and recovery support services, by establishing state policies and holding participating state agencies accountable for carrying out those policies.⁴

The commission must develop, review, and update a comprehensive substance use prevention, substance use disorder treatment and recovery support services plan, that may include:⁵

- capacity, type, and utilization of programs;
- methods to assess the effectiveness and performance of programs;
- the best use of existing programs;
- budget policy priorities for participating state agencies;

- standards for licensing programs;
- minimum contracting standards;
- the most effective and efficient use of participating state agency resources to support programs; and
- youth substance use prevention and youth substance use disorder treatment and recovery strategies to reduce substance use disorders among individuals who are up to 36 years of age and their families.
