**Bill Title:** Relating to mobile pharmacies; prescribing an effective date.

**Government Unit(s) Affected:** Board of Pharmacy, Oregon Health Authority, Counties

**Summary of Fiscal Impact:** Costs related to the measure are indeterminate at this time - see explanatory analysis.

**Measure Description**

The measure requires the Oregon Board of Pharmacy (OBOP) to issue licenses to mobile pharmacy operators. The measure specifies eligibility requirements for licensure, as well as minimum standards and prohibitions for mobile operators. OBOP may establish a licensure fee for mobile pharmacies by rule, with moneys from fees deposited in the existing State Board of Pharmacy Account. Any new or increased fees adopted by OBOP by rule, as allowed under this measure, would be subject to the legislative fee approval process outlined in ORS 291.050 and ORS 291.055.

**Fiscal Analysis**

Board of Pharmacy

The measure has an indeterminate fiscal impact for OBOP. Currently, the board anticipates that work related to the establishment and processing of the new license type can be done using an existing limited duration position that is being paid for with one-time vacancy savings. However, the board may need to return to the Legislature for additional resources for the 2027-29 biennium. The actual workload related to issuance of licenses and mobile pharmacy inspection processes will not be known until the agency conducts rulemaking around this new license type, and the agency may need to request additional position authority once rulemaking is complete. Given the timeline for rulemaking, the agency’s position needs may not be known until after submittal of the 2027-29 agency request budget.

Other entities

The measure has no fiscal impact on counties or the Oregon Health Authority.

**Relevant Dates**

The measure takes effect on the 91st day after sine die.

The measure is operative January 1, 2027. OBOP may take any action needed before the operative date to be able to issue licenses by January 1, 2027.
