## **Minimal Revenue Impact**

In 2017, Washington State mandated that individual servings of solid edible cannabis products be wrapped in separate packaging. Reviewing total cannabis sales and the market share of edible products before and after these policy changes provides a useful comparison for evaluating the potential effects of the proposed changes to Oregon's regulations.

From 2016 through 2019, total cannabis sales in Washington increased steadily. During the same period, the market share of solid edible products remained relatively stable, with a slight upward trend. This trend suggests that the packaging requirement did not have a meaningful impact on overall cannabis sales or consumer purchasing patterns.

Additional analysis was conducted to assess how potential price changes for edible cannabis products might affect sales revenue. Looking at Oregon information from 2022 through 2025, decreases in edible cannabis prices were associated with small decreases in sales. This pattern is consistent with a weakly inelastic market, in which consumer demand is relatively insensitive to price changes.

Taken together, this information indicates that changes to packaging requirements in Oregon are likely to have minimal revenue impact on state or local tax revenue.
