

House Bill 4026

Introduced and printed pursuant to House Rule 12.00. Presession filed (at the request of House Interim Committee on Commerce and Consumer Protection for Representative Nathan Sosa)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**. The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: Tells a state agency to look at consumer protection and do a report. (Flesch Readability Score: 63.4).

Requires the Department of Consumer and Business Services to study consumer protection. Directs the department to submit findings to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to consumer protection not later than September 15, 2027.

Sunsets on January 2, 2028.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to consumer protection.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. The Department of Consumer and Business Services shall study consumer protection. The department shall submit a report in the manner provided by ORS 192.245, and may include recommendations for legislation, to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to consumer protection not later than September 15, 2027.

SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2026 Act is repealed on January 2, 2028.
