**SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure. The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

**Digest: The Act lets DOC workers help out with enforcing immigration laws for some felons. (Flesch Readability Score: 65.7).**

*[Digest: The Act says that a person can sue a person who under color of law comes in property without a warrant or an exception. (Flesch Readability Score: 62.6).]*

*[Creates a civil cause of action against certain individuals who under color of law enter certain property without a warrant or an exception to the warrant requirement. Allows for an award of attorney fees to a prevailing plaintiff and, under certain circumstances, to a prevailing defendant.]*

*[Declares an emergency, effective on passage.]*

**Authorizes Department of Corrections employees to coordinate with a federal immigration authority in carrying out any action concerning a person convicted of certain felonies.**

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. Notwithstanding ORS 180.805, 181A.820 and 181A.822 to 181A.829 and any**  
5 **other provision of Oregon law, all employees of the Department of Corrections may coordi-**  
6 **nate with any federal immigration authority when the federal immigration authority is car-**  
7 **rying out any action concerning a person convicted of a felony listed in ORS 137.700 (2),**  
8 **aggravated murder, a felony sexual offense or any felony offense in which there was an ac-**  
9 **tual or threatened physical injury to the victim.**
