

# Senate Bill 1595

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**. The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: The Act says that some boards have to publish some information and make sure staff get trained by January 1, 2028. (Flesch Readability Score: 60.6).

Requires a professional licensing board to publish specified guidance regarding licensure and ensure certain staff receive culturally responsive training not later than January 1, 2028.

Declares an emergency, effective on passage.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to professional workforce; creating new provisions; repealing sections 2 and 3, chapter 618, Oregon Laws 2025; and declaring an emergency.

**Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

**SECTION 1. A professional licensing board as defined in ORS 670.415 shall publish the guidance described in ORS 670.415 not later than January 1, 2028.**

**SECTION 2. A professional licensing board as defined in ORS 670.415 shall comply with the requirements of ORS 670.415 not later than January 1, 2028.**

**SECTION 3. Sections 2 and 3, chapter 618, Oregon Laws 2025, are repealed.**

**SECTION 4. This 2026 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2026 Act takes effect on its passage.**

**NOTE:** Matter in **boldfaced** type in an amended section is new; matter [*italic and bracketed*] is existing law to be omitted. New sections are in **boldfaced** type.
