37 **(Item No. 19), the amount of \$4,300,000 is established for a six-year period beginning July 1,**
38 **2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses for the Corvallis Armory Service Life**
39 **Extension project from federal funds collected or received by the Oregon Military Depart-**
40 **ment.**
