**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO  
HOUSE BILL 4057**

1 On page 4 of the printed bill, delete lines 3 through 29 and insert:

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3 **“REPORT ON STREAMLINING EDUCATION BACKGROUND CHECKS**

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5 **“SECTION 3. (1) The Department of Education, in consultation with**  
6 **the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission, the Department of**  
7 **Early Learning and Care and the Department of State Police, shall:**

8 **“(a) Develop recommendations to allow individuals who are enrolled**  
9 **in the Central Background Registry established under ORS 329A.030 to**  
10 **automatically satisfy any background check requirement under the**  
11 **jurisdiction of the Department of Education or the Teacher Standards**  
12 **and Practices Commission, including an analysis of any legal, opera-**  
13 **tional, technological, privacy, financial or other relevant consider-**  
14 **ations.**

15 **“(b) Analyze the similarities and differences among background**  
16 **check requirements for individuals subject to the jurisdiction of the**  
17 **Department of Education, the Teacher Standards and Practices Com-**  
18 **mission and the Department of Early Learning and Care.**

19 **“(c) Analyze how federal law, including the Child Care and Devel-**  
20 **opment Block Grant Act of 2014 and any federal regulations adopted**  
21 **under the Act, applies to and constrains the authority of the state in**

**developing recommendations under paragraph (a) of this subsection.**

**“(2) The recommendations under this section must comply with public records law, ORS 192.311 to 192.478 and federal law, including the Child Care and Development Block Grant Act of 2014 and any federal regulations adopted under the Act.**

**“(3) The Department of Education, in consultation with the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission, the Department of Early Learning and Care and the Department of State Police, shall submit a report on the subjects described in subsection (1) of this section in the manner provided by ORS 192.245, and shall include recommendations for legislation, to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to education and early learning and care no later than November 15, 2026.”.**

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
