**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO RESOLVE CONFLICTS TO  
A-ENGROSSED SENATE BILL 1594**

1 In line 2 of the printed A-engrossed bill, after “immigration;” insert  
2 “creating new provisions;” and after “180.810;” insert “repealing section 6,  
3 chapter \_\_\_, Oregon Laws 2026 (Enrolled Senate Bill 1538);”.

4 After line 17, insert:

5 **“SECTION 1a. If Senate Bill 1538 becomes law, section 6, chapter**  
6 **\_\_\_, Oregon Laws 2026 (Enrolled Senate Bill 1538) (amending ORS**  
7 **180.810), is repealed and ORS 180.810, as amended by section 1 of this**  
8 **2026 Act, is amended to read:**

9 “180.810. (1) The Attorney General shall publish model policies intended  
10 to limit, to the fullest extent possible consistent with state and federal law,  
11 immigration enforcement at public schools, public health facilities, court-  
12 houses, public shelters and other public facilities operated by a public body.

13 “(2) When the Department of Justice develops, reviews or updates the  
14 model policies described in subsection (1) of this section, the department  
15 shall consult with the Office of Immigrant and Refugee Advancement.

16 **“(3) For the purpose of developing a policy under subsection (1) of**  
17 **this section for public schools for kindergarten through grade 12:**

18 **“(a) The Attorney General, in addition to consulting with the Office**  
19 **of Immigrant and Refugee Advancement under subsection (2) of this**  
20 **section, shall consult with organizations representing school board**  
21 **members and other public school professionals.**

1       **“(b) In addition to any content of a policy developed under sub-**  
2 **section (1) of this section, a model policy published for public schools**  
3 **for kindergarten through grade 12 must include:**

4       **“(A) A process for verifying the validity of any warrant or court**  
5 **order involving immigration enforcement;**

6       **“(B) A requirement that the superintendent of the school district**  
7 **or the education service district, or the superintendent’s designee, re-**  
8 **view and approve any response to a law enforcement request involving**  
9 **immigration enforcement;**

10       **“(C) Provisions that encourage the superintendent of the school**  
11 **district or the education service district, or the superintendent’s**  
12 **designee, to consult with legal counsel of the district or a statewide**  
13 **or regional education organization prior to responding to any immi-**  
14 **gration enforcement efforts;**

15       **“(D) Requirements to ensure compliance with ORS 180.805 and**  
16 **181A.826; and**

17       **“(E) Recommendations for how employees of the school district,**  
18 **education service district or public charter school will respond to im-**  
19 **migration enforcement efforts.**

20       **“(4)(a) All school districts, education service districts and public**  
21 **charter schools must provide to the employees of the school district,**  
22 **education service district or public charter school applicable model**  
23 **policies published by the Attorney General under this section.**

24       **“[(3)] (b) All public bodies to which paragraph (a) of this subsection**  
25 **is not applicable** are encouraged to implement policies based on the model  
26 policies described in subsection (1) of this section.

27       **“[(4)] (5) Any entity that contracts with a public body to provide services**  
28 **related to physical or mental health, education or access to justice is en-**  
29 **couraged to adopt policies based on the model policies described in sub-**  
30 **section (1) of this section.**

1        “[5] (6) The Attorney General may adopt rules to implement this section.  
2        **“SECTION 1b. The amendments to ORS 180.810 by section 1a of this  
3        2026 Act become operative on July 1, 2026.”.**
