Dear Senator/Representative,

My name is Terry Donahe, and I live in Lake Oswego. I am writing in strong support of \*\*HB 4134 with the -1 amendment ("1.25% for Wildlife")\*\* to create a dedicated, long-term funding source for the protection and restoration of Oregon's most vulnerable fish, wildlife, and habitats through a modest 1.25% increase in the state transient lodging tax.

Oregon's identity is deeply tied to its natural legacy. Our native fish, wildlife, and diverse landscapes — including the high desert and sagebrush steppe — are central to what makes this state special and why people choose to live and visit here. The State Wildlife Action Plan now identifies more than 300 species of greatest conservation need, including about 100 found in Oregon's high desert. Without stable, dedicated funding, we risk continued decline of the species and ecosystems that define Oregon.

HB 4134 provides a practical, long-term funding mechanism to support science-based conservation, habitat restoration, wildlife connectivity, invasive species control, and wildfire resilience. This type of sustained investment is far more effective and economical than emergency, after-the-fact responses once species become critically endangered.

Healthy wildlife and habitats are also essential to Oregon's economy. Outdoor recreation and tourism depend directly on healthy landscapes and waters. Together they support hundreds of thousands of jobs and billions in consumer spending across the state. We cannot maintain a strong recreation and tourism economy without investing in the natural systems that support it.

I am personally active in the outdoors — including skiing, snowshoeing, hiking, backpacking, climbing, rafting, and kayaking — and I value the opportunity to experience Oregon's wild places and wildlife firsthand. Protecting biodiversity and habitat today helps ensure these opportunities remain available for future generations.

At a time when federal conservation funding and protections are uncertain, state leadership is especially important. Passing HB 4134 would position Oregon as a national leader in proactive, durable wildlife conservation.

I respectfully urge you to \*\*support and vote in favor of HB 4134 with the -1 amendment\*\*.
