Dear Chair Lively and members of the Committee,

On behalf of the Bend Chamber of Commerce and Economic Development for Central Oregon (EDCO) we appreciate the opportunity to share our support for HB 4102.

The Bend Chamber serves 1,650 members and 8,500 businesses in our local community. EDCO is a private, non-profit organization serving the tri-county region of Crook, Deschutes, and Jefferson Counties whose mission is to strengthen communities by creating opportunities that generate new revenue and family wage jobs.

Our organizations have heard from various stakeholders and businesses in our Central Oregon communities that have first-hand experience with delays processing air and water quality permits. Many of these businesses have experienced delays well beyond the 6-month timeframe outlined in the bill, as well as additional administrative hurdles often encountered at the end of the clock.

This issue is not only an administrative efficiency matter but also has significant economic impacts for our community as well as the state a whole. Projects and regulated entities governed by DEQ permitting are significant economic drivers; they create jobs and contribute to a strong property tax base. Not to mention the downstream impacts on local communities. Oregon already has limited tools for economic development, recruitment and retention of traded sector businesses, and we support the proactive policies outlined in the bill to support the businesses that choose to make Oregon home.

Thank you for the opportunity to provide comments in support of HB 4102 and we appreciate the leadership of Reps. Lively and Dobson, and to our local Rep. Emerson Levy, to advance this important legislation.
