



HB 4029: Consumer Protections for Solar Sales



It's time to make buying solar more transparent.

Stakeholders, including the solar industry, consumer advocates, and utilities, collaborated over the last year to develop a robust set of requirements to protect Oregonians when they buy or lease a solar system.

The goal is to enable the solar industry to continue expanding in Oregon while preventing bad actors, often coming in from out of state, from taking advantage of Oregonians.

Highlights of the bill

- Requires a written disclosure in plain language to ensure customers are receiving what they've been promised, including space for the customer to initial their acknowledgement
- Identifies the components of the required disclosures
- Outlines what needs to be included in the written contract
- Clarifies the right of the consumer to rescind the contract within three business days and not incur any costs
- Provides for consumer-led enforcement if a sales solicitation uses any deceptive statements concerning the costs, financing, or terms and conditions of the contract
