The oath of office for members of the Oregon Legislature requires them to affirm their support for the U.S. Constitution, the Oregon Constitution, and to perform their duties faithfully and ethically. You can find the specific wording and details through the Oregon Secretary of State's website or related state resources.

What Content is Required in an Oath of Office for it to be Valid?

Article 1, section 7 of the Oregon Constitution requires that the administration of any oath of office occur in a manner that binds "upon the conscience of the person to whom such oath or affirmation may be administered." In other words, the oath should be administered in such a way that the person making it recognizes the importance of the words they are uttering, so that it binds their "conscience."

These year in and year out ill conceived, do little to directly stop crime or suicide, anti 2nd Amendment attacks do nothing to address the underlying issues that the Oregon legislature never seems to address with skill.
