HB4088

As the parent of a trans identified child and as a woman, I am concerned about both sex-based rights and child protection. I oppose HB 4088 because the proposed bill confuses broadly supported reproductive health care for females with experimental and potentially harmful "gender-affirming" treatments, diluting sex-based protections by prioritizing gender identity over biological reality.

Risks to Minors and Vulnerable Groups — the bill shields irreversible interventions that have weak long-term evidence, while non-cooperation clauses could block probes into regret or harm and favor ideology over child safeguarding.

Erosion of Sex-Based Rights — Provisions easing name/sex changes in the name of privacy could undermine single-sex spaces like women's shelters, prisons, and sports by enabling unchecked legal recognition of gender identity, contributing to the erasure of sex distinctions and compelled speech concerns.

Lack of Accountability and Evidence — Provider immunities risk protecting ideologically driven care without requiring rigorous informed consent or follow-up studies.

Broader Societal Impacts — The bill may fuel medical tourism from restrictive states, strain Oregon resources, and normalize practices rooted in sexism or homophobia.
