This short-sighted bill is nothing more than a smoke and mirrors game by the supermajority body politic: a temporary reduction of other taxes to introduce a sales tax, bringing Oregon on par with the few states that have the "Big Three" of taxes: Property, Income and Sales, and in true Oregon Democrat fashion, will start the round robin of incremental increases after a few sessions of letting rates rest, so that voters will forget and retain those that implemented the bill in office.
