Chair Golden, Vice-Chair Nash, and Members of the Committee,

Thank you for introducing the Climate Superfund bill. I look forward to you passing it out of committee with a do-pass recommendation. The fossil fuel pollution during the covered period (1995 - 2024) from major polluters has been and will be responsible for many billions of dollars of damage in Oregon. During, and even before, the covered period major polluters knew full well the damage they were inflicting on us.*

Just like the tobacco companies who tried to hide the harms of smoking, the fossil fuel companies must be held accountable to pay for the harm they have knowingly caused. They have hundreds of billions of dollars in profits-- unfortunately partially fueled by government subsidies and tax breaks-- while ordinary Oregonians families, homes and businesses are being pummeled by climate disasters.
