I do not want autonomous vehicles on the streets of Portland. Waymo has been a disaster in San Francisco and we should always learn from the mistakes of others. The facts of the matter are these: autonomous vehicles are far over-promising and seriously under-delivering. They are not capable of making judgement calls of the quality that safe driving requires. They increase congestion. They put the decision making power as to the value of a human life into the hands of massive, self-centered, profit-driven corporations. Case in point: Tesla recently released its 'mad max' mode for its semi-autonomous vehicles. This mode instructs the vehicle to ignore stop signs and speed limits. If we want to get people from point A to B efficiently, quickly, and without them having to drive, we have far better solutions in bus rapid transit, subways, high-speed rail, grade-separated light rail, and prioritized, traffic separated street cars.
