To the House Committee On Judiciary,

As a resident of Oregon who will likely never have cause to interact with Federal and out of state agents or officers, I support this bill. The overwhelming amount of evidence that citizen and non-citizen rights are being violated on a daily basis compels me voice my support for stricter regulation of law enforcement activities in this state, specifically those carried out at the behest of an overreaching federal government.
