I take advantage of these small farm stands alongside HWY 101 every summer. I am also interested in starting a berry produce venture in the future, and if this bill went into effect, I would be unable to sell berries from my small property. We need more local options for diverse, fresh, healthy food, increasing our food security and reducing our global impact.
