This bill does *nothing* to address whatever fine-tuning might be needed to improve the working of legitimate farm stands around the state. HB1453 is a bulldozer called in to fill a small gopher hole in a farmers' field.

HB1453 is supported by all the same actors who, last year, *opposed* the work of LCDC's rulemaking committee. Through a campaign of misinformation, they, and an assortment of speculators destroyed LCDC's work that might have actually addressed their supposed grievances. It is clear from their support of HB 1453 that these special interest groups don't want to fix anything. They want to destroy the agricultural underpinnings of Oregon's world-famous land-use laws.
