My name is Alice, and I live in Bend, Oregon. I am submitting this testimony in strong support of HB 4134 with the -1 amendment to increase the state lodging tax by 1.25% and help recover Oregon's most vulnerable fish, wildlife, and habitats.

I originally moved to Oregon because I love exploring the natural environment. As someone who grew up in a place with limited access to public lands and protected environmental places, I feel incredibly lucky to now call Oregon home. With that privilege, I believe there comes a responsibility to protect our wildlife and public lands for future generations. As we have seen summer wildfires and minimal snow this winter, Central Oregonians are increasingly concerned about how we can protect our wildlife and wild places through policy and action. A small lodging tax works perfectly for our community, which sees heavy tourism from visitors looking to take advantage of our incredible wildlife and outdoor recreation opportunities.
