Wildfires have caused many people to be displaced for months, even years. My husband and I lost a home close to Elkhorn Golf Course in Lyons, Oregon. It was a place that held many years of memories as our vacation home. It was not as devastating to us as it was to neighbors whose homes were their primary residence. Besides the lose of homes, it was devastating to the natural habitats that existed there. The expenses to rebuild, reconstruct, were on the backs of individuals, local and county governments and non-profit organizations. The losses were enormous! This is just one example of the potential damages that occur not only with fires, but with pollutions that are responsible for destruction of habitats and of human health.
