HB 4105 jeopardizes the implementation of the Western State Forest Habitat Conservation Plan (HCP) that Oregon's communities have have fought so hard for and HB 4105 also prevents the Oregon Department of Forestry from managing its forest to sequester carbon. Clear cutting will release untold tons of carbon into the atmosphere and destroy already dwindling habitat and wildlife of all shapes and sizes.
