Measure, Appointment or Topic: SB1598

Unelected officials must NOT be able to make decisions / create rules concerning medical procedures, including vaccines. We must be able to choose which vaccines and medical procedures we will have and which not. Those decisions must be made by the individual person and if needed, with their doctor's guidance.
