Measure, Appointment or Topic: SB1598

Dear Chair Patterson, Vice-Chair Hayden and Members of the Committee;

My name is Tricia Hafner, and I am writing as an Oregon mother to respectfully express my opposition to SB 1598.

As a parent, my top priority is the health and well-being of my children. I strongly support access to quality health care and preventive services for families across Oregon. However, I am deeply concerned about the scope of authority this bill grants and the potential long-term impact it could have on medical decision-making for families like mine.

SB 1598 appears to allow preventive services and immunizations to be expanded based on future determinations and gives broad standing-order authority to public health leadership. While I understand the importance of public health preparedness, decisions that affect medical care for families should include strong guardrails, transparency, and clear legislative oversight to maintain public trust.

As a mother, I am particularly concerned about:

- The possibility that future preventive services or immunizations could be added without direct legislative approval.
- The potential for standing medical orders to be issued broadly instead of being carefully tailored to specific risks or emergencies.
- Ensuring strong protections for informed consent and parent involvement in medical decisions for their children.

Oregon has always valued both strong public health systems and individual rights. I respectfully urge lawmakers to consider amendments that would:

- Require legislative review for major expansions of mandated coverage.
- Strengthen transparency and public reporting requirements.
- Protect patient choice, parental rights, and provider discretion.

Oregon has always said that medical decisions should be between a doctor and patient and I would like to see legislation that improves and respects this relationship. This bill seems to break that relationship and turn it over to an unelected board.

I respectfully ask you to oppose SB 1598 in its current form or amend it to better balance public health goals with family medical autonomy and accountability.
