**Re: Support for Senate Bill 1501 (2026 Regular Session)**

Dear Chair and Committee Members,

I am writing to express my strong support for **Senate Bill 1501**, a measure that authorizes the Oregon Department of Administrative Services to negotiate and enter into agreements to establish a joint authority to **own and operate the Moda Center** in Portland, Oregon. The bill also creates the **Oregon Arena Fund** to support the ongoing expenses of facility operations, renovation, and related capital improvements.
