The fourth amendment of the Constitution of the United States (below) provides protection from unreasonable search and seizure unless law enforcement has a judicial warrant and/or probable cause of criminal activity. Searching a home without a warrant is prohibited under the fourth amendment, which is supported by a long history of US case law.

With federal agents now grossly disregarding this law of the land, we need to reenforce the peoples' right to prosecute federal agents for damage to property and violations of civil rights. Please advance HB 4114 A with a "do pass" recommendation to show that Oregon respects and supports its peoples' fourth amendment rights.

Text of the Fourth Amendment

"The right of the people to be secure in their persons, houses, papers, and effects, against unreasonable searches and seizures, shall not be violated, and no Warrants shall issue, but upon probable cause, supported by Oath or affirmation, and particularly describing the place to be searched, and the persons or things to be seized."
