Dear Chair Prozanski, Vice-Chair Thatcher, and members of the Senate Judiciary Committee,

My name is Kathy May Ingelse, and I live in Sisters, Oregon. I'm writing in strong support for HB 4088 A.

With increasing attacks from the federal administration on reproductive rights and LGBTQ+ health care, patients are concerned for the continuity of their care and health care professionals are fearful for their safety. This bill is critical in safeguarding patient privacy, protecting medical providers from mounting criminalization threats, and ensuring that all Oregonians can receive the health care they need without fear or discrimination. The increasing number of threats in the last few years makes the need for this bill urgent. Oregonians cannot afford to wait. In Oregon, this care remains legal and providers should be able to deliver it without fear of federal intimidation or retaliation.

This bill is important to me because, as a nurse practitioner in family and psychiatric mental health care, I see patients who are currently fearful to have private health information public. I work at a volunteer clinic , all of our patients depend on privacy in their health care and records.

As a Nurse practitioner, I am concerned that the evidence based, legal medical care I provide, may be challenged impacting both the patients I provide care to, and for my own ability to have a livelihood I have been working in for the past 40 years.

If this bill is not passed, there are numerous implications which harm Oregonians, patients and providers.

- HB 4088A protects access to evidence-based health care in Oregon, including the rights of all Oregonians to make personal medical decisions with their physician, without fear or intimidation of government interference.
- As federal and out-of-state threats escalate, Oregon has a responsibility to protect its providers' ability to practice medicine and protect personally identifiable patient data and identity records.

I urge you to vote YES on HB 4088 A to protect patients, providers, and privacy in Oregon. Thank you for your time, service, and commitment to the people of Oregon.
