Re: COIN Testimony in Support of HB 4114 A

Dear Chair Prozanski, Vice-Chair Thatcher, and Members of the Senate Committee on Judiciary,

I am writing on behalf of the Consolidated Oregon Indivisible Network - COIN - in strong support of the cause of action provided in HB 4114 A for searches conducted without a warrant by federal agents in vehicles on private property, churches and other places of worship, schools, medical facilities, and any place where people have a reasonable expectation of privacy.

COIN is a network of more than 70 Indivisible groups across Oregon that work to protect our democracy, including the fundamental right of Oregonians to be free from unreasonable searches and seizures. Accountability of government agents particularly for their infringement of fundamental rights is central to democracy. Right now Oregonians are experiencing great uncertainty and fear as federal so-called enforcement actions increasingly encroach on and threaten our long cherished rights, including the right to be free of unreasonable searches and seizures. It is only with clear limits on the authority and accountability of federal agents for overreach of their authority that we can protect our democracy and restore public trust in our government.

Our nation built on the concept of individual liberties is now 250 years old. Unless we want this to be one of the last years of our American democracy, it is imperative we take steps now to protect it. HB 4114 A is a strong step in pushing back against out of control federal agents operating with no regard for our right to be free from unreasonable searches and seizures. Please vote yes on HB 4114 A.
