I primarily use edibles as medication. This bill would make edibles inaccessible to me while also having no bearing on my ability to safely store edibles away from children.

I have always had a naturally high tolerance for cannabis and the smallest dose I can take and still receive medicinal benefits is 50 milligrams. This means I already am only able to buy two doses at a time. This bill would have me buying 1/5 a dose at a time! Can you imagine filling a prescription for a 30 day supply of a daily medication and receiving 150 bottles with 1/5 of a pill inside each one? No, because that's absolutely insane and you're reasonable enough to understand that this makes no sense—economically or otherwise.

I may likely resort to learning to make my own edibles if this passes. I imagine a good amount of Oregonians like me probably will. Then, you'll have a surplus of unregulated and ambiguously dosed edibles in circulation (with no packaging or labeling at all).
