Attention House Committee, Re: SB1598

My name is Lisa Shelton, I am an Integrative and Bioindividual Nutrition Practitioner (M.Ed, CHC, BNP), and I completed Integrative Medicine Academies Autism Mastery Course specializing in biomedical approaches for autism. I am writing to you today to express my deep concern for SB1598. Children need to have access to schools without medical discrimination. And insurance companies who profit from vaccine sales should not be recommending or paying for them, as Oregon tax payers ultimately pay the financial cost enabling pharmaceutical companies to profit. Please make sure legislature is required to review and approve new insurance mandates in order to protect transparency, independence and public trust.

I am the mother of two children in the Ashland School District (one graduated). My younger child has autism spectrum disorder (ASD). I understand principles of do no harm and bioindividual wellness. Not all people are equally suited to safely receive vaccinations/biologics. Some people are genetically vulnerable with decreased methylation/detoxification abilities, therefore, their more vulnerable body systems are not equally equipped to process environmental toxicants including ingredients and adjuvants found in vaccines/biologics.

To date, there have been no studies comparing vaccines to true placebos. Rather vaccine studies have compared vaccines to administered neurotoxic adjuvants, and this is bad science and misleading when it comes to informed consent. Nor have there been studies examining the cumulative impact of multiple vaccines.

We do have independent studies comparing unvaccinated children to vaccinated children with observations noting greater risk of developing chronic health conditions in susceptible children following vaccination (Lamerato, L. et al. 2020. Lyons-Weiler, J. and Thomas, P, 2020). In comparison, unvaccinated children were found to have far greater health. These findings warrant further investigation in order to safeguard our children.

Should SB1598 go into effect children would be denied access to education. Children with real health concerns not medically recognized for exemption may be forced to risk their health in order to receive education. It is imperative that bioindividuality be recognized in health management, and to safeguard this we need full transparency on financial conflicts of interest. The people need to be able to make their own educated health choices and not be forced to enrich private companies through state mandates. Please make sure legislature is required to review and approve new insurance mandates in order to protect transparency, independence and public trust. I look forward to hearing back from you.
