Measure, Appointment or Topic: SB1516

I oppose this bill as it is currently written. I urge you to strengthen SB 1516A. Technology needs regulation to prevent government overreach, especially in the context of the current administration and its use of warrantless searches and surveillance. As such, the following changes should be made:

1. Retain ALPR data for a maximum of 21 days, following the example of Maine and Virginia
2. Require ALPR vendors to use real end-to-end encryption, that is clearly defined in law.
3. Define in law when it is appropriate to use ALPR cameras, focusing on felonies and the most serious offenses.
