

1. The actions contained within this draft legislation are an egregious violation of the rights of all Oregonians. This draft prevents the exercise of 2nd amendment rights through obfuscation and deception.
2. Serious privacy issues in the fingerprint process and the illegal registry created by this bill are a direct violation of individual rights.
3. Special groups are still exempt from the permitting process, why? Why aren't others??
4. HB4145 attempts to limit firearms access through increased costs, delays, and infringements upon Oregonians from those of you who should be serving to protect their constitutional rights.
5. Nowhere is this more obviously identified than through the inclusion of a false emergency declaration narrative.

As a constituent I vehemently urge you to vote this legislation down.

Considerations:

- HB4145 has privacy issues with the permitting process, fingerprinting, and installation of illegal "Registries". One in Oregon and an additional at the Federal level. This will face legal challenge.
- Prices and delays Oregonians out of exercising their constitutional rights.
- Exempts law enforcement, when purchasing a personal firearm, from the process of applying and waiting for a permit to purchase like all other Oregonians. Why is this special class included and why aren't active and retired military or other first responder classes exempt? Because this clause is an attempt to limit push back by law enforcement agencies.
- Exempts law enforcement, when purchasing a personal firearm, from being put on the "Registries". See above.
- Enables Oregon State Police to set rules/law on magazine limitations. This will face legal challenges given recent Supreme Court rulings.
- Removes 'Shall' issue permitting, with the clause that it may be denied based on a subjective ruling, without adjudication, by the issuing authority. Disenfranchisement of the regular citizen.

Additional considerations on HB4145:

- This is not about saving lives, it is all about removing Oregonian's right to self-defense.
- Increases fees (\$65-\$150, +130%) and creates delays (30-60 days,+100%), with no recourse by Oregonians when the schedule is not met and must be restarted.
 - Delays with the training requirement creates a 3-4 month delay for an Oregonian to exercise their 2nd amendment and self-defense rights.
 - The increase in fees and delays prevent some Oregonians from exercising their constitutional rights to self-defense.
- Installs a gun owner registry that can be misused or breached; a direct violation of federal law.

- Seeks to manipulate the judicial system by requiring all legal challenges be completed through the Marion Circuit Court. This legislation is so biased the authors know it will not survive legal challenges outside their district.
- Inappropriate/unethical use of the emergency clause preventing Oregonians from deploying the referendum process.
- Moves the magazine affirmative defense date to January 1, 2027.
- Moves BM114 implementation to Jan 1, 2028.
